Migration and Global Learning; New KS2 Activity Kit

There is a brand new Activity Kit for Key Stage 2 based on the theme of Migration.

This topic is firmly in the international spotlight, with increased media attention on the “migrant crisis”. It’s an issue that affects our lives in many different ways, and pupils will have a variety of opinions depending on their circumstances. This Activity Kit provides information and teaching ideas and encourages pupils

to think empathetically and more deeply about this topic. With links to English and Literacy, Geography and History, this can also be used as a stand-alone item to promote discussion and understanding.
